Registration is accomplished by completing the registration form and returning it to the Office of the Registrar, Western Maryland College, Westminster, Maryland 21157. A \$5.00 late registration fee is charged after June 10 first term and July 15 second term.

STUDENT SERVICES

ROOM AND BOARD

WITHDRAWAL POLICY

It is assumed that a student will not withdraw from the college during a term. In the event that such a withdrawal is necessary, the effective date will be established by completion of an official withdrawal form approved by the Registrar. The grade of "W" will be recorded if withdrawal occurs before July 8 first term and August 10 second term.

REFUND POLICY

At any point in time after the start of the semester the following refund policy will prevail based on class days for the regular term.

TUITION:

Less than 3 days - 80% - Between 3 and 4 days - 60% - Between 5 and 6 days - 40%
Between 7 and 8 days - 20% Over 8 days - No Refund

ROOM:

No refund unless room can be filled with another student. If room is filled, refund will be pro-rated from date of withdrawal.

BOARD:

A pro-rated refund for board will be made from date of withdrawal. The effective date of withdrawal is established by the Registrar.
