

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REGISTRATION PROCEDURE

1. Registration may be accomplished by mail or in person at the Office of the Registrar.

2. Obtain a registration form from the Registrar's Office (301) 848-7000, Ext. 215.

3. Return the completed form to WMC as soon as possible. Any registration after June 13 for courses starting June 20 or July 14 for courses starting July 21 requires payment of an additional \$15 late fee.

4. For each course listed enclose \$25. This is non-refundable, unless the College cancels the course, but is part of the total tuition of \$139 per semester hour.

5. Courses with insufficient enrollment will be cancelled on June 13 for Summer Session I and on July 14 for Summer Session II.

6. The \$25 deposit paid at registration will hold a space in the class; however, tuition must be paid in full before the first class session. A late fee of \$15 will apply on registrations received later than one week before the first class. Checks should be made payable to Western Maryland College. No student will be permitted to enter class, enroll in a subsequent course, or graduate until all financial obligations are met.

7. Students may purchase books at the College Store which is open Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

8. Academic policies and student life policies may be found in the undergraduate catalog and in the student handbook. 9. An * indicates prerequisite courses are required. Check the catalog.

10. All changes in registration (adding, dropping, changes in grade options, etc.) must be made through the Registrar's Office.

11. Summer school regulations allow students to register for a maximum of 7 credits in the summer. More than 7 credits require the Dean's approval.

12. A student may officially withdraw from Summer Session by dropping all courses through the Registrar's Office without academic penalties if the withdrawal occurs before the midpoint of the class. After the midpoint the grade of F will be recorded.

13. Final exams are held during the last class meeting in the course classroom.

14. All courses are three credits unless otherwise specified.
