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## REGISTRATION PROCEDURE

1. Registration may be accomplished by mail or in person at the Office of the Registrar.
2. Obtain a registration form from the Office of the Registrar (301) 857-2215
3. Return the completed form to WMC as soon as possible. Any registration after June 15 for courses starting June 19 or July 16 for courses starting July 20 requires payment of an additional \$15 late fee.
4. For each course listed enclose \$25. This is non-refundable, unless the College cancels the course, but is part of the total tuition of \$156 per semester hour.
5. Courses with insufficient enrollment will be cancelled on June 14 for Summer Session I and on July 13 for Summer Session II.
6. At the first class the instructor will verify the attendance of each student. If a student does not attend the first class the College will interpret this as notice that the student is dropping the course. Students will be dropped from the class rolls and will need to pay a \$25 reinstatement fee in order to be readmitted.
7. The Office of Student Accounts will mail bills covering the balance of fees at once; the balance is due upon receipt of the bill.
8. Students may purchase books at the College Store which is open Monday - Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.
9. Academic policies and student life policies may be found in the undergraduate catalog and in the student handbook.
10. An \* indicates prerequisite courses are required. Check the catalog.
11. All changes in registration (adding, dropping, changes in grade options, ect.) must be made through the Office of the Registrar.
12. Summer school regulations allow students to register for a maximum of 7 credits in the summer. More than 7 credits require the Dean's approval.
13. A student may officially withdraw from Summer Session by dropping all courses through the Office of the Registrar without academic penalties if the withdraw occurs before the midpoint of the class. After the midpoint the grade of F will be recorded.
14. Final exams are held during the last class meeting in the course classroom.
15. All courses are three credits unless otherwise specified.
