This is the second year Western Maryland College has been working under an honor system. This academic ideal has taken its place as an integral part of campus life and has proved to be an effective means of elevating the school's scholastic standing.

With the foresight and backing of the Student Government Association, an appointed committee investigated various aspects of an honor code and drew up a working system. The group presented their ideas to the student body and faculty for approval. After the inevitable process of incorporating suggested changes and needed clarifications, the system went into effect.

Members of the honor court are chosen from letters of application submitted by the students. As stipulated in the codified system, six seniors, six juniors and four sophomores comprise the court. The court tries all infractions concerned with academic honor. Anyone who violates the code is on his honor to report the misdemeanor to the court within twenty-four hours. Fairness in judgment and secrecy of trial proceedings are the main objectives of the group.

The court elects its own officers. This year's president is William MacDonald and the recorder is Priscilla Ord. These two people are present at every trial.

Western Maryland is proud of its efficient and effective honor system. In only two years, it has gained a deep-rooted respect and value on the college campus.
