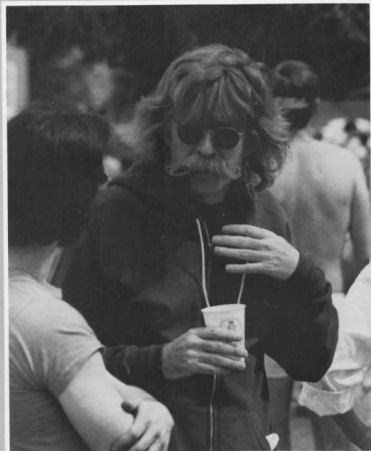
College is more than a place to learn.

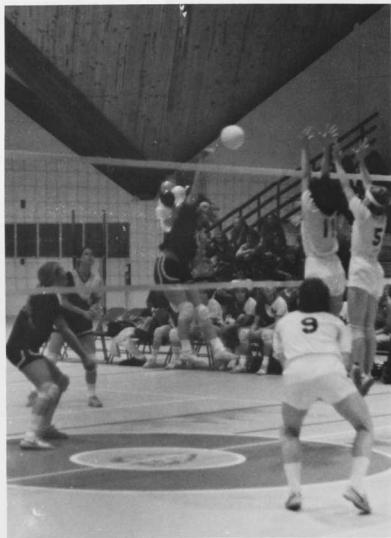
"If We Don't Win . . .

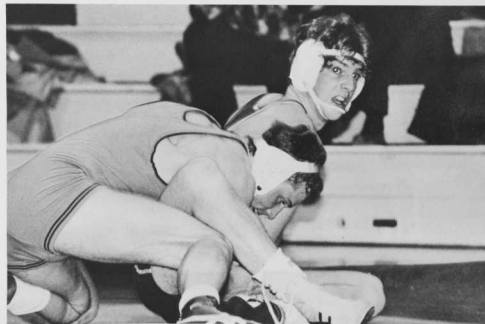
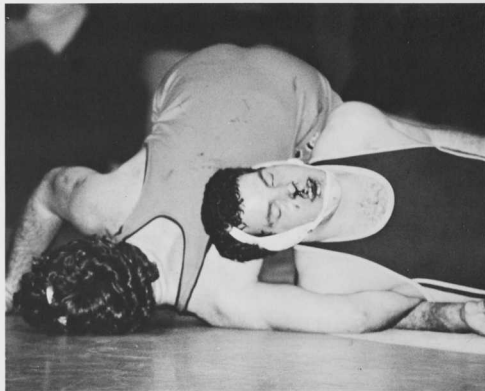
'... The Same Tough Competition We Always Have.'

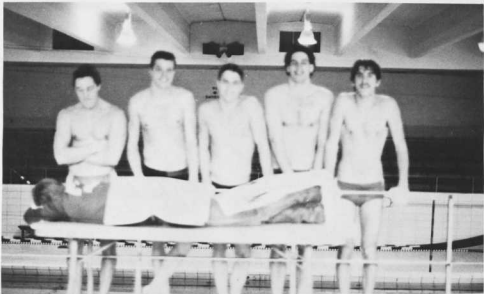

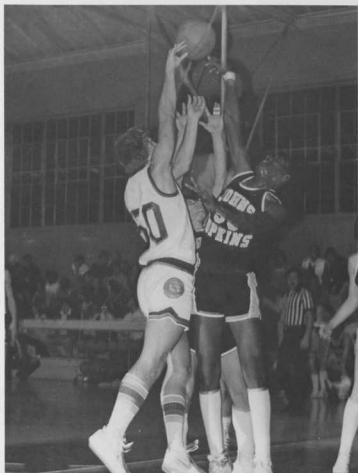

With just one more win not only would the team have set a new record for wins in a season, but it would have evened its ten year record at the .500 mark.

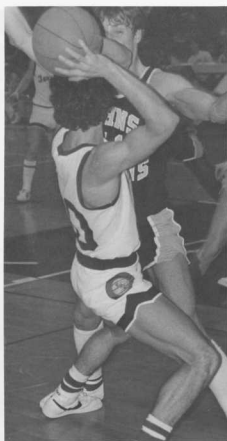

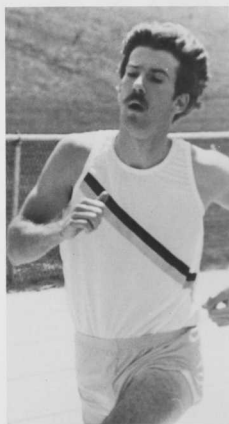

Third baseman Dave Yurcisin batted .440, was the run scoring leader with 20, and made just one error.

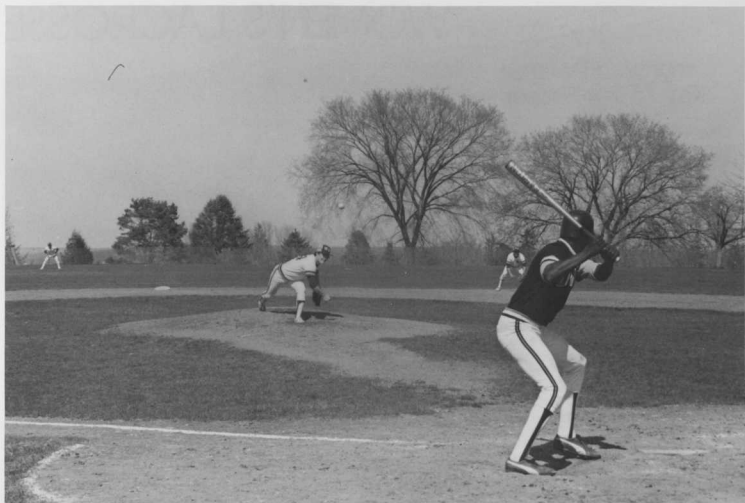
Dave Hall batted .390, while Sam Kerns, a late inning replacement and occasional starter, batted .421.

MEN'S LACROSSE

Seven Game Streak Caps 8-2 Overall Season

Westminster, Md.— When the 1982 men's lacrosse season began, defense seemed to be the weakness of the Western Maryland College team.

Not that the defense was all that bad. But with the likes of Eric Schwaab, Ron Hiltz, Lou Boeri and Jeff Funk returning, the offense was supposed to steal the show.

The offense held up its end of the deal, averaging almost 14 goals per game. The guys with the long sticks, though, proved to be a pleasant surprise for first-year coach Mike Williams, holding opponents to just eight points per game.

Unfortunately, the Terrors' 8-2 season record failed to qualify them for either the Middle Atlantic Conference Championships or a trip to the NCAA Division III playoffs.

WMC breezed past its first seven games, the only close contest a 13-11 come-from-behind victory against Mount St. Mary's. Things began to fall apart after that though.

The first loss was not unexpected, but the severity of it was. Washington College, the nation's number two team in Division III, handed Western Maryland a 22-7 loss.

Four days later, the Terrors were still reeling from that game. What should have been a laughter against Lynchburg College (4-13 for the season) turned into a close 13-9 squeaker for WMC. Only a strong second half effort and some good play by the defensive midfield saved the game.

The last game of the year was the showdown for the MAC West title at Franklin & Marshall, and the Diplomats outshot the Terrors, 57-31, en route to a 43-7 win. F & M went on to lose to Swarthmore in the league playoffs, and no MAC representative was among the eight teams chosen for the NCAA tourney.

The stellar defense was led by senior Bill Jackson, from Centerville, Md. In fact, after allowing Villanova's Kevin McHugh to score the first goal of the season against the Terrors, no player being defended by Jackson scored in a controlled offensive situation until late in the season.

Jackson consistently drew the opposition's best attackman, and consistently shut him down. Against Gettysburg College, he held Paul Bowersox to just one assist, while Washington College star Jeff Kauffman scored all four of his goals on fast breaks, usually caused by midfield lapses, not bad defensive play.

Northport, N.Y. native Peter Schmitt and Baltimorean Dave Michling rounded out the starting defense, which four times held opponents to only three goals (including defending MAC champ FDU-Madison) and gave up more than ten goals just three times.

Perhaps the most important change for the Terrors, though was the addition of the long-stick, or defensive, midfielders, who were inserted when the opponent was set up in a controlled offense.

That unit was the difference in the Lynchburg win, and played a key role in the second half surge against Mount St. Mary's. The



group includes Lutherville, Md. native Jamie DeGraft (just a freshman), sophomore Chris Imbach, from Baltimore, and senior Dennis Vancheski, also from Baltimore.

The defense also played well in spite of sickness and injury. Junior Michael Jackson (no relation to Bill), from Catonsville, Md., missed the season with an injury, while Dennis Oltman, of Pasadena, Md., missed some games because of a virus.

Despite having a better overall season in 1982 than in 1981, goalie Chuck Nolan failed to make the MAC all-star team. The Baltimorean was a second-team pick in 1981. In 1982, he allowed just 67 goals while stopping 135, for a .668 percentage.

Back-up Ben Price, from Annapolis, Md., allowed 14 while stopping 24, for a .650 mark. Overall, the goalies stopped 66.5 percent of the shots on goal.

The offense was led by two familiar faces, attackman Eric Schwaab and Ron Hiltz.

Schwaab, from Eldersburg, Md., tied with Hiltz for the team's scoring honors with 23 goals, was easily the team's assist leader with 34, and led the squad in total points, with 57.

Three times the senior scored four goals in one game, while he assisted on seven in one game and six in two others. His four goals and seven assists against Dickinson was the most points scored by a Terror in one game this season.

Besides being tied for first in scoring, Hiltz was second on the squad with 22 assists, and second overall with 45 points. The Baltimore native had two five-goal performances and, like Schwaab, had at least one assist in every game.

Lou Boeri, from Towson, Md., was penciled in as the third starting attackman, and opened the season with a bang, scoring seven goals and assisting on five others in the first two games of the season.

An unfortunate hand injury kept the senior out of the next five games, although he did come back to tally six more goals in the last three games. Boeri's replacements through that five game stretch, Jim Emche (Baltimore) and Stan Murray (Hampstead, Md.), combined for nine goals and six assists.

While the 1981 team's offense was totally dominated by attackmen, the 1982 group got more help from the midfield. Leading the middies were Brian Loftus and Jeff Funk.

Loftus is from Maplewood, N.J., hardly a hotbed of high school lacrosse, but the junior poured in 20 goals and two assists, to finish third on the team with 22 points. His best showing was a four-goal performance against Lebanon Valley.

Funk, of Cockeysville, Md., was the only Terror to score at least a goal in every contest. His 16 goals and 5 assists tied him for fourth-place scoring honors with Boeri.

Midfielder Jeff Kuzemchak, from Parkville, Md., scored 13 goals and added 3 assists despite missing three games with an injury.
