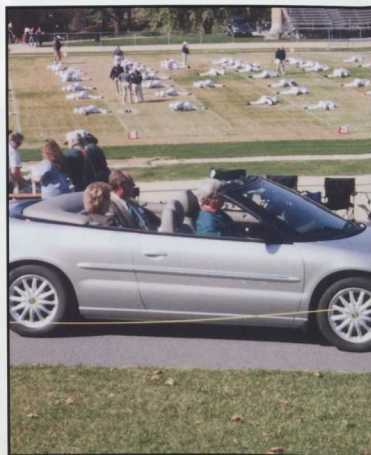

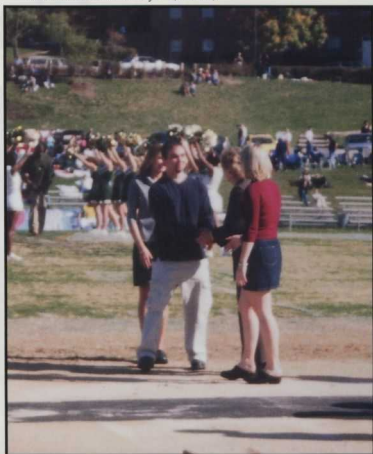

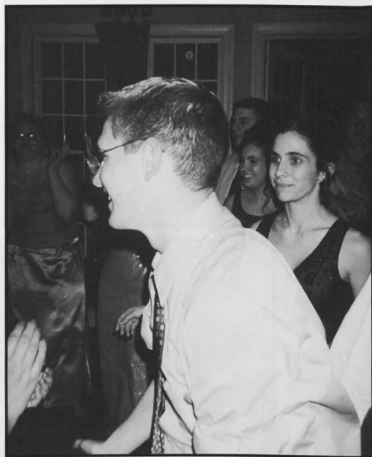

During Jan Term, the Board of Trustees announced their decision to change the name of the College. However, this decision did not sit well with many students, parents, and alumni. They wondered why the Board decided to announce the name change at a time when most students and faculty were not on campus. A petition against the name change was circulated on the internet and lots of media coverage ensued. The Board asked everyone for their input on a new name suggestion.

In mid-April, the Board met and voted on the new name for the College. It remained a secret until the campus-wide announcement on May 10, 2002. At that time, the College held a party on campus and gave away tee shirts imprinted with the new name and logo. Those who were not able to attend that evening could log onto a website or dial an 800 number to learn the new name.

On July 1, 2002, *Western Maryland College* became *McDaniel College* in honor of William McDaniel. Over his 65-year association with the College, William McDaniel was a student, alumnus, professor, treasurer, vice president, acting president, and trustee of Western Maryland College. The Board deemed it quite fitting to honor Mr. McDaniel in this way.

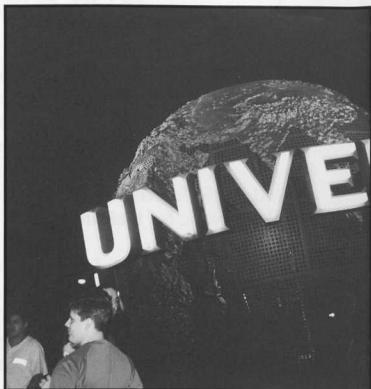


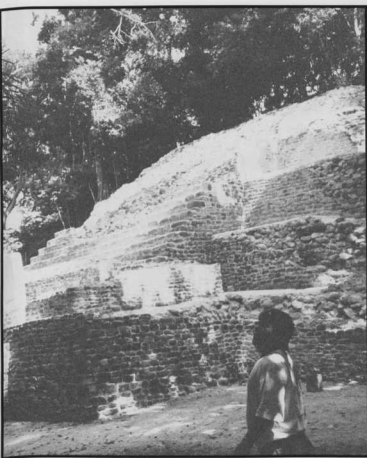
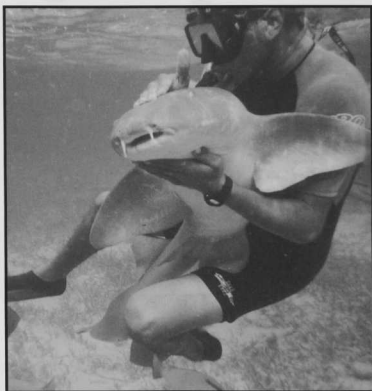
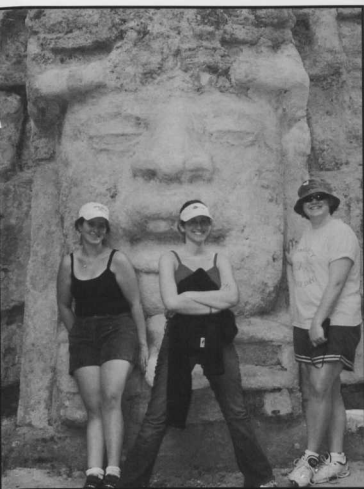

Spring Fling

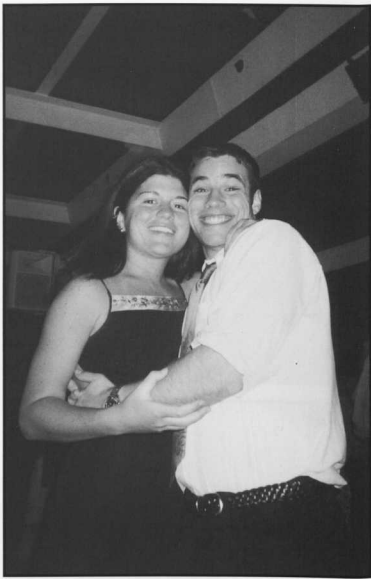

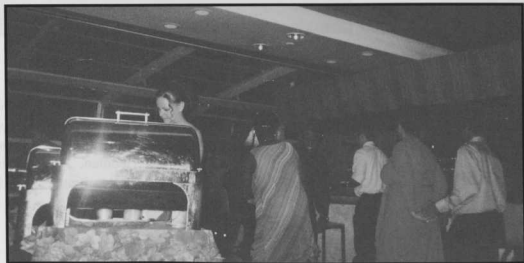
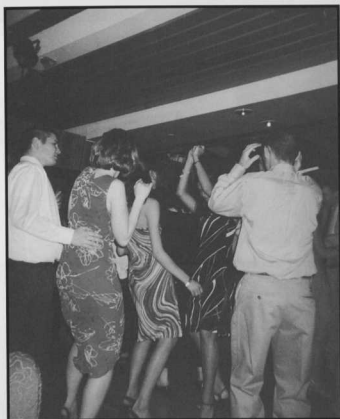




Spring Formal

Blanche Ward Hall is one of the most active dorms on campus. With some of the fraternities and sororities living there. There are also other sophomore, junior and senior men and women living there.

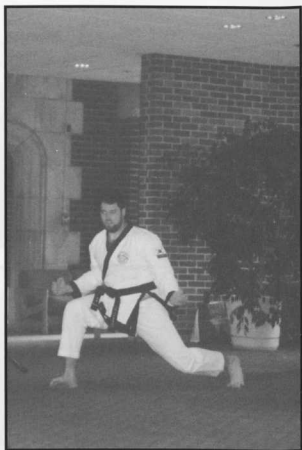


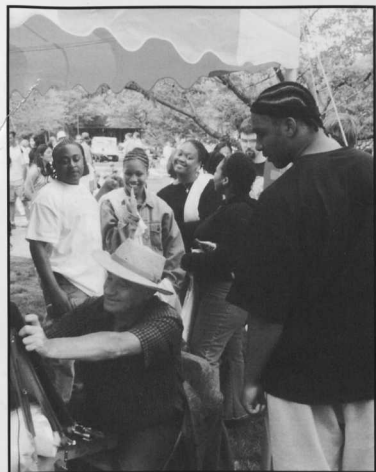
On the other side of campus is the quieter dorm, Daniel MacLea. All of the honor students live there, which includes freshmen, sophomores, juniors and seniors.

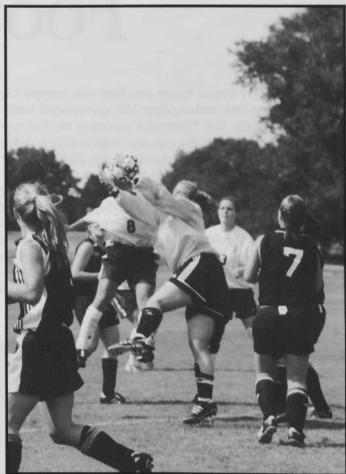
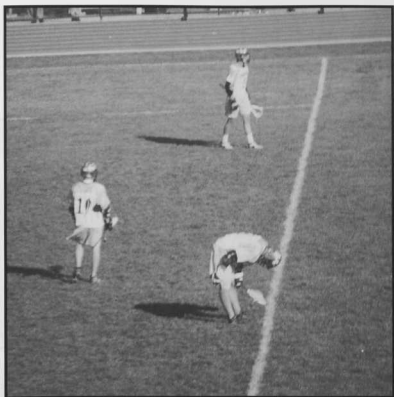






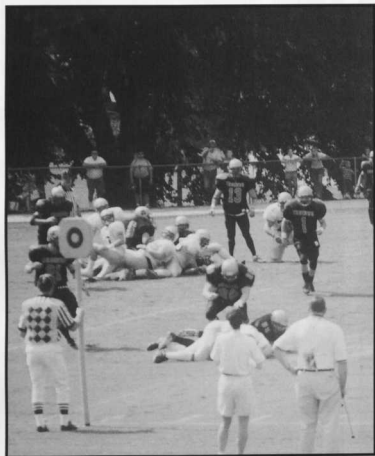






Football

The 2001 Green Terror won their fifth straight Centennial Conference title, earning their fifth consecutive berth into the NCAA playoffs. The Terror was ousted in the first round by the third ranked team in the country, Washington & Jefferson. 17 of the WMC players were named to the All-Centennial Conference football team. 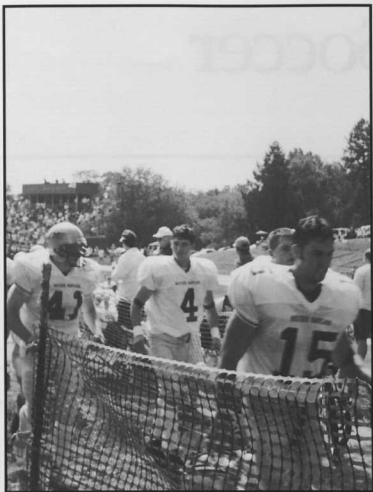


The football team gets the ball after a tackle. (above)

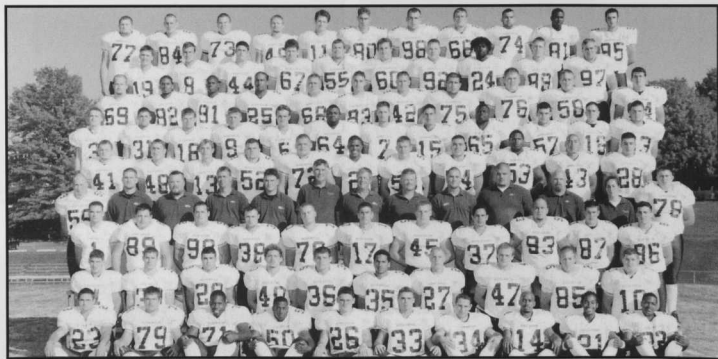

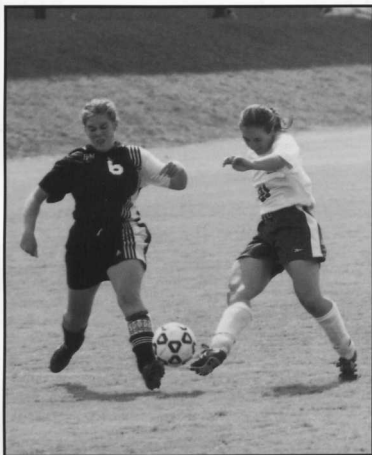

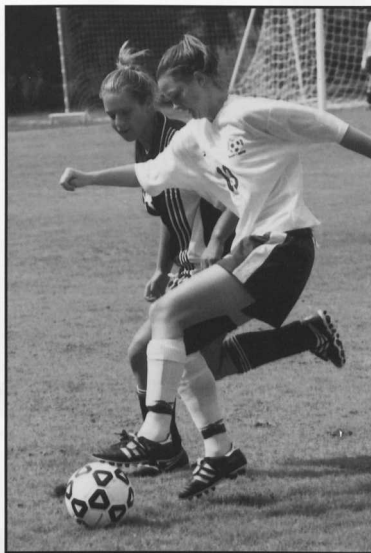
Women's Soccer

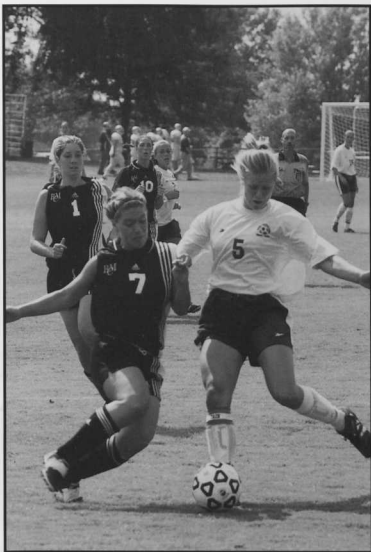


This lady Terror fights to keep control of the ball with the other team's defender. (above)

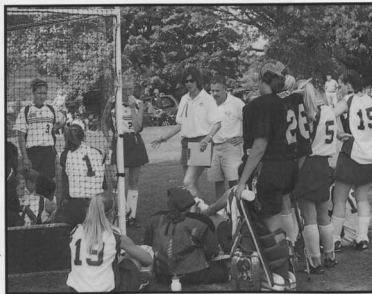
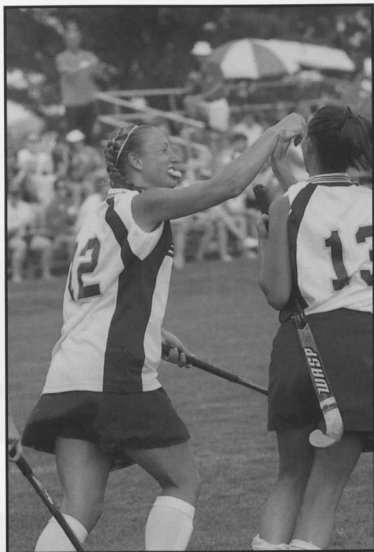
Field Hockey

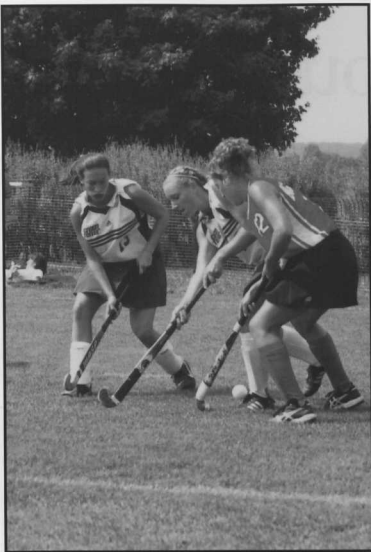

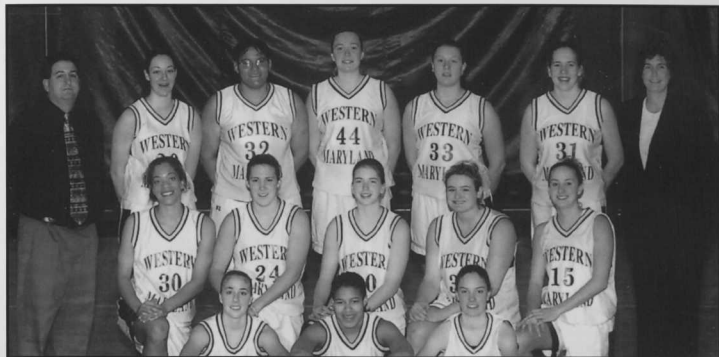
Women's Basketball

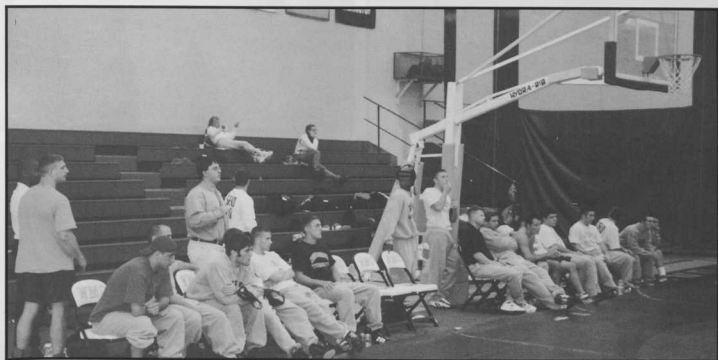
Wrestling

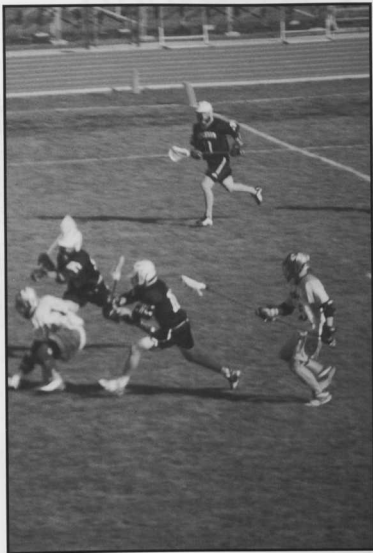




Men's Lacrosse
