


The Academic Hall building dedication was held on Saturday, October 1,2005. This 59-million building is the new home for Psychology, Education, Graduate and Professional Studies.



CHOSTS ON

If you decide to take in a performance in Western Maryland College Alumni Hall, be careful where you sit. You may have an apparation patron blocking your year. But, then again, you'd be able to see right through him. His rame is Harvey. He's the ghost of R.O. Store, inchraimed Harvey, who was a divinity student in 1920. Harvey was torn between his love of the theatre and his deep religious convictions. The pressure became so great that he hung himself, not in Alumni Hall, but in his dorm room in Old Main, which was raz ed in 1959. So when you go to Alumni Hall, check out the center seat in the first row of the balcony. You may get a glimpse of a ghostly presence!

Be careful when doing your laundry in the basement of Blanche VVard Hall. If you turn your back, you may have your clothes folded for you or thrown across the room! Who she is, no one knows, but she has two very boisterous children in tow. One student has even witnessed the laundry room door closing shut, and the woman entering through it and exting through a wall. Who can she be? Perhaps, a former College employee.

CARROLL HALL

The year is 1863, and the setting is the College's Admissions Office, Carroll Hall. A confederate army is on their way to Gettysburg, when they are ambushed by Union troops. A young colonel from the South is wounded and taken to Carroll House, where a makeshift field hospital has been set up. The soldier dies there in one of the upstairs bedrooms, but his spirit never leaves. He seems to delight in the invention of electricity, since Campus Safety has found lights on in the building and doors unlocked after the staff have left-knowing full well that the building was secured and darkened before their departure. I you look closely at an upstairs window, you may just see someone from the past looking back.

THE HILL

The Rearing 20's was an era of flappers, gangsters, and prohibition—a wild time indeed. Unfortunately, it was a decade that the College lost four of its students. Besides Harvey, there is the story of Eliz aboth Gillelanuwho took her life with a rope in the closet of her room in. McDaniel Hall. It is not clear what drove her to such a horrific demise, but she has been known to walk the halls of McDaniel gasping for air ever since. She has also been spotted walking from the gaz cloo back to her down.





The Ward Memorial Arch has been moved twice in the Colleges lifetime. It was originally erected between the President's House and McDaniel Hall, where horse-drawn carriages would enter the campus heading toward Old Main. The Arch was dismantled in: 1936 and moved to the corner of Main and Union Streets. With the new configuration of Main. Street in: 2003, the Arch was moved again. When visitors approach the College from Main. Street, the Arch sits prominently at the top of the hill as part of a fitting entrance to the campus. It is numered that on a full moonlit night, if you stand under the Arch and look back toward the College, you will see it as it was in the late 1800's.

The third student to end his life in the 1920's was Edgar Covington, the first SGA President, a star athlete and all-around "Joe College." One night on campus, for reasons unknown, Edgar hung out with his friends, bid them good night, went back to his room, and drank a bottle of poison. Perhaps he was distraught over the death of Eliz aboth, since they had been classmates.
