



History of the Alma Mater

Each morning, students are greeted by the familiar melody of the school's Alma Mater echoing from Baker Memorial Chapel. The song was written by Laurence Webster Bates, an alumni of Western Maryland College, and it was introduced to the College community in 1901. By 1905, the song was accepted by the College as it's official Alma Mater.

In 1925, a more contemporary version of the song appeared in the school yearbook *Aloha*. This modified version was written by chemistry professor Dr. Herbert L. Rich.

The Alma Mater would remain the same until 2003, when the lyrics were slightly modified to reflect the College's name changed from Western Maryland College to McDaniel College.

David W. Herlocker Professor of Chemistry Emeritus




Professer Herlocker died unexpectedly at the age of 67 at his home in Westminster in March.






